OVERVIEW

INDICATOR	SUMMARY
<p>HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION</p>	<p>Married couples, both with and without children, constitute just over half of households in Collin and Denton counties and less than half of households in Dallas County. People living alone make up nearly a quarter of households, while non-family households make up 6-8% of the homes in the region. Twenty one percent of Dallas County households are made up of single mothers or fathers with children in the home. Single-headed households comprise 13% and 14% of households in Collin and Denton counties respectively.</p>
<p>IMMIGRATION</p>	<p>An estimated 1,350,000 undocumented immigrants resided in Texas in 2005, a 19% increase since 2000 estimates. The bulk of legal permanent residents (green card holders) in North Texas come from Mexico (6,070). Along with Mexico, residents from India (2,573), China (997), Vietnam (807) and El Salvador (697) make up the five largest legal permanent resident populations in the area.</p>
<p>MIGRATION</p>	<p>The number of migrants to the Dallas Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) increased by 13,359 (from 15,612 in 2003) to 28,971 in 2005. In 2004, international migration contributed to 33.1% of statewide population change, while domestic migration made up 7.2% of this growth. Natural population increase accounts for the remaining 59.7% of population change.</p>
<p>AGE</p>	<p>The North Texas region has a relatively young population with median ages of 33.6, 32.4, and 32.2 years in Collin, Dallas and Denton counties respectively.</p>
<p>INCOME</p>	<p>More than 32% of Collin County residents had incomes over \$100,000 in 2005. This compares to 24.7% of Denton County residents and 14.9% of Dallas County residents. Twenty-seven percent of Dallas County residents had incomes less than \$25,000 while 16.8% of Denton County and 14.2% of Collin County residents fall into this category.</p>

SUMMARY

Texas is one of the 10 fastest growing states in the nation with a 22.8% increase in population from 1990-2000 and a 12.7% increase from 2000-2006 (Texas State Data Center, Office of the State Demographer), with the North Texas Region being one of the fastest growing regions in the state. The state is also the second largest state in the country, behind California (Texas State Data Center, Office of the State Demographer, 2006). In Texas, 67% of the increase in population from 2000-2005 can be attributed to the Hispanic population; and projected rates for the year 2040 puts that rate at 77%.

In the United Way Metropolitan Dallas four county region (Collin, Dallas, Denton, Rockwall), the population from 2000-2006 has grown by 15% or approximately 476,000 persons. In our region, Rockwall County has been the fastest growing, with a growth rate of 61% from 2000-2006; and Dallas County had the slowest growth rate with only a 6% increase from 2000-2006. The Collin, Dallas, and Denton County Region has seen a 10% increase in population, most of which came from the 31% increase in the Hispanic/Latino population and 40% increase in the Asian population. This three County region has seen at 13% increase in persons under the age of 18 and a 17% increase in persons under the age of 5, from 2000-2005, Collin and Denton Counties being the main areas for this increase.

Denton County is the only region to have seen an overall increase in median income levels between the years 2000 and 2005 with a 5.68% increase, leading to a 1.47% increase in the average median income for the three county area. Dallas and Collin Counties both saw minor decreases in the median income level for the county.

INDICATOR HIGHLIGHTS

Data for the Demographics Chapter was gathered from the United States Census Bureau's American Community Survey, 2005. This survey provides detailed population and housing information on an annual basis to support programs and policies at the Federal, State, and Local levels. It is important to note that the 2005 American Community Survey universe is limited to the household population and excludes the population living in institutions, college dormitories, and other group quarters.

Also, due to the small size of Rockwall County data is unavailable from the 2005 Community Survey. The 2005 American Community Survey (ACS) does not present data for all geographic areas. Data from the 2005 ACS are available for over 6,000 geographic areas with a population of 65,000 or more, including 761 counties (Dallas, Denton, and Collin Counties are included).

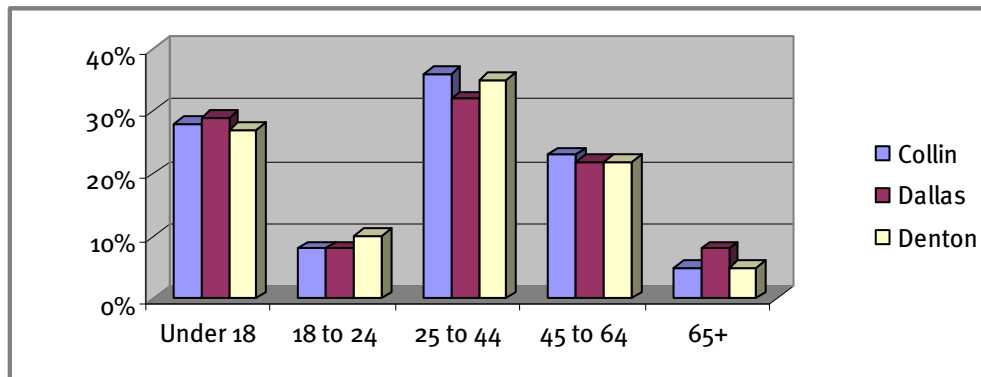

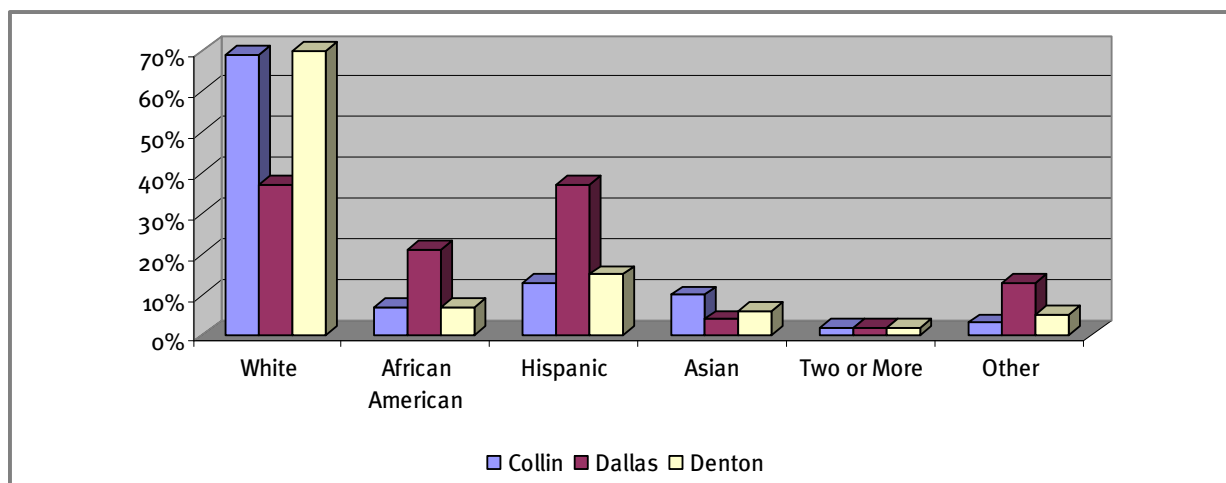

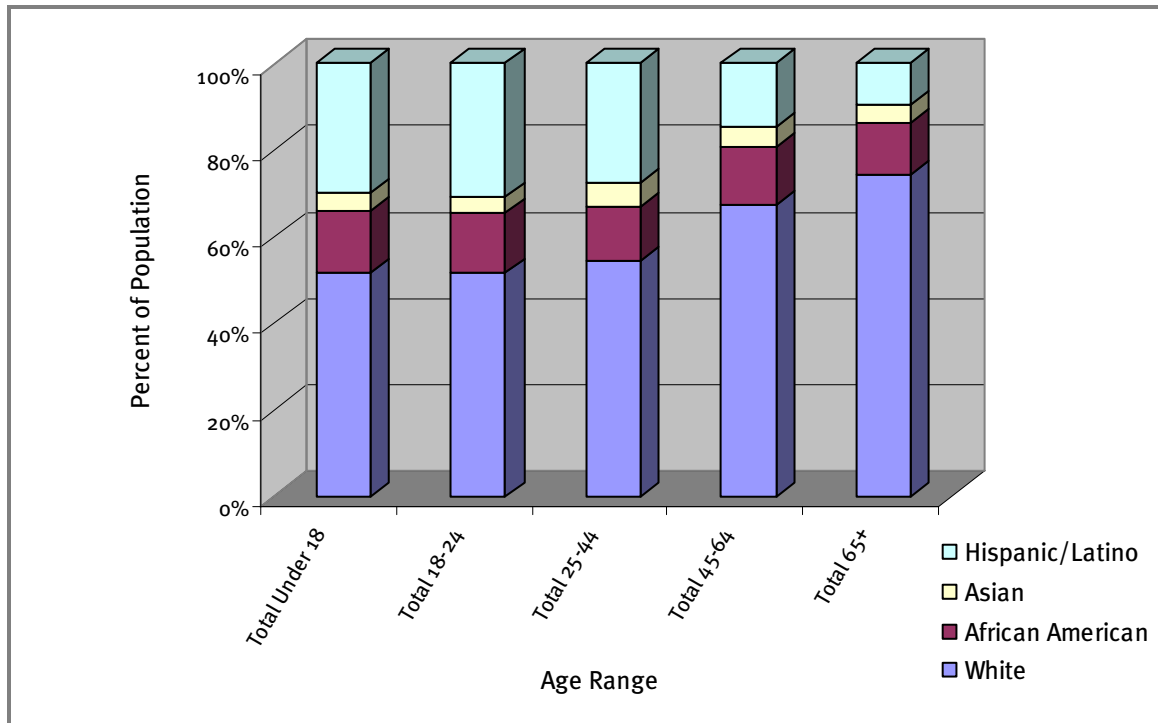

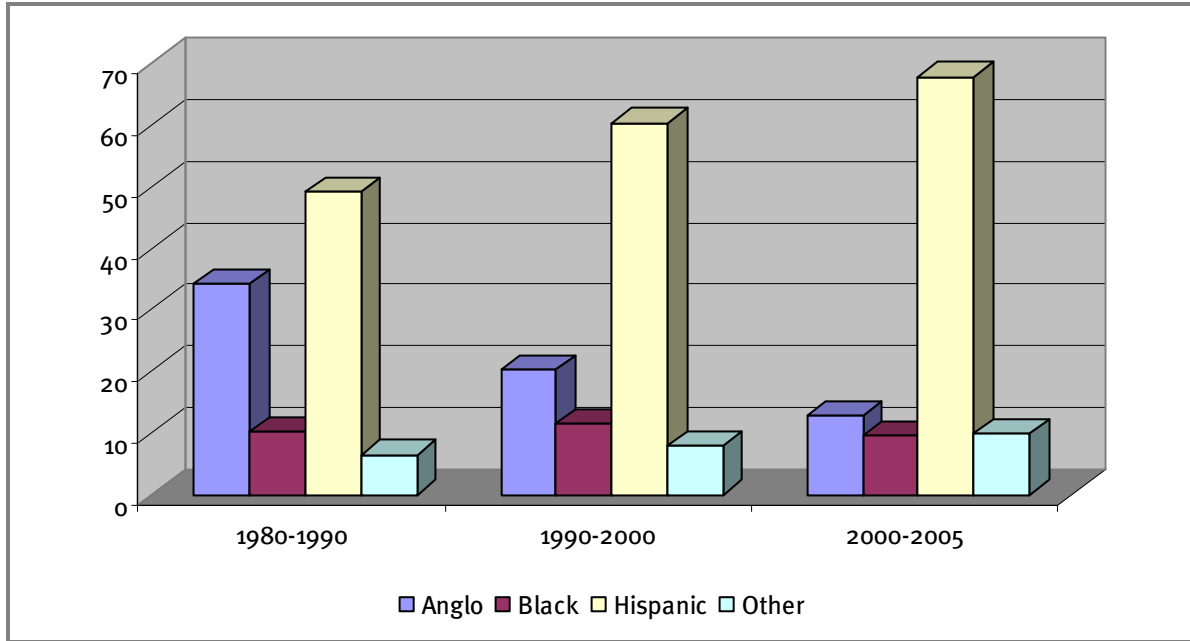

Proportion of Net Population Change Attributable to Each Race/Ethnicity Group in Texas for 1980-1990, 1990-2000 and 2000-2005

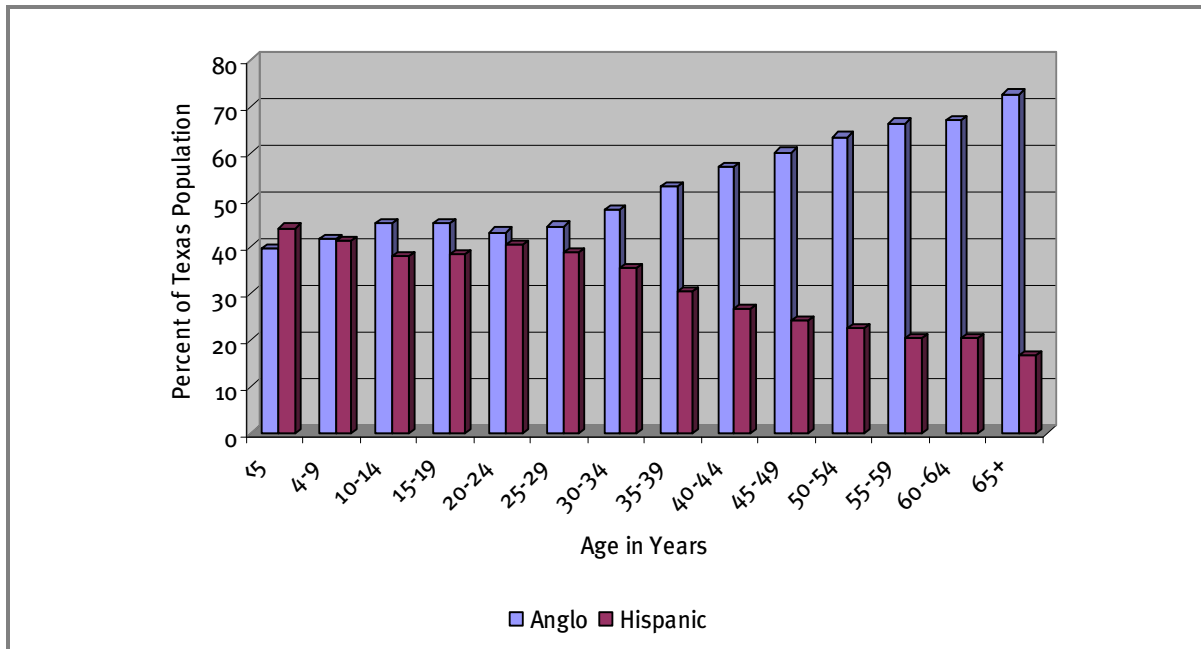

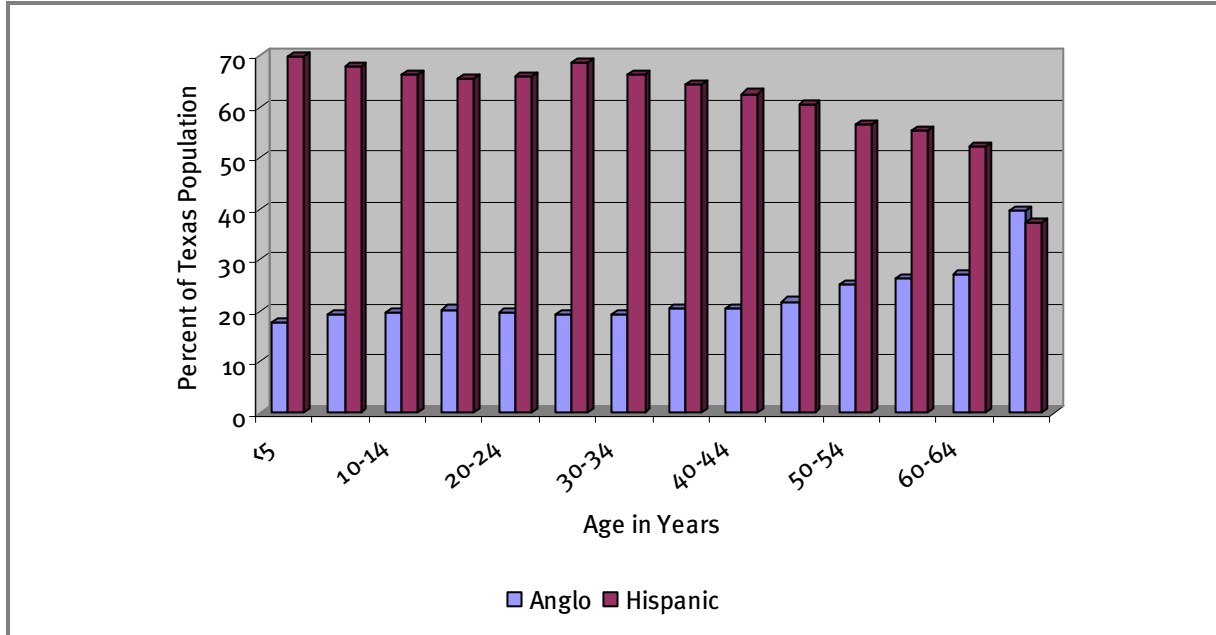
PERCENT OF TEXAS POPULATION BY AGE GROUP AND ETHNICITY, 2000

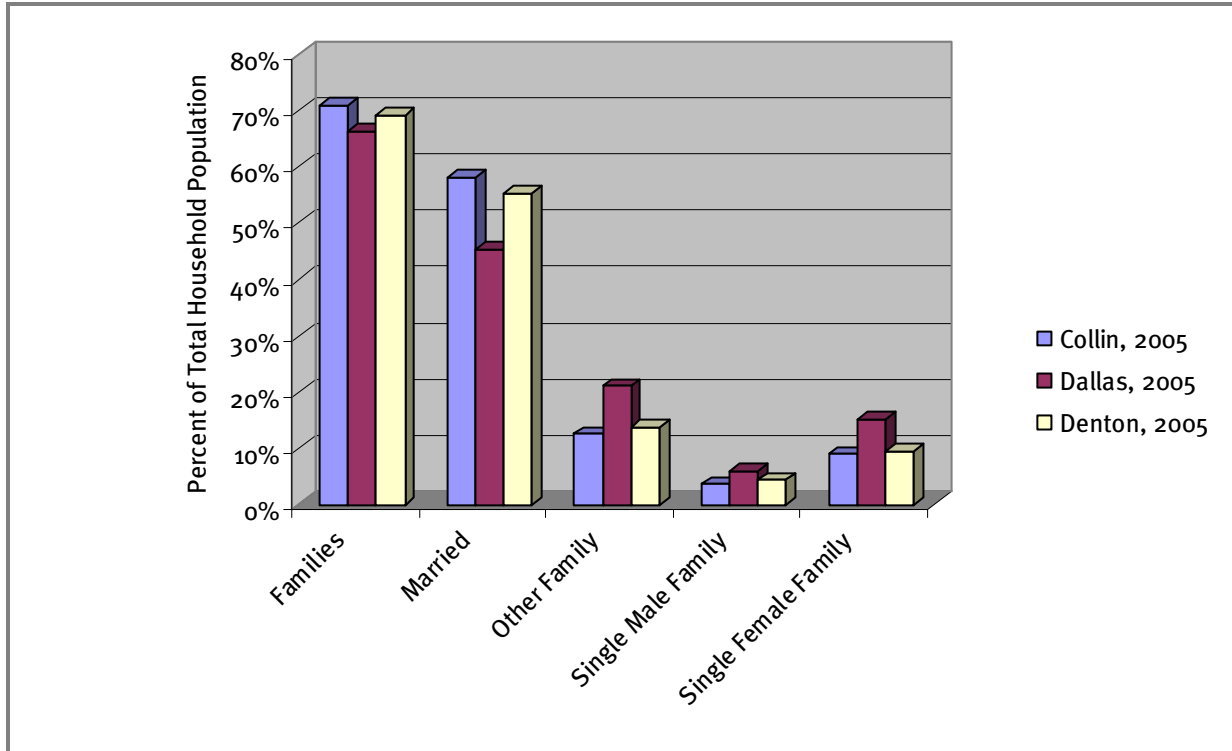

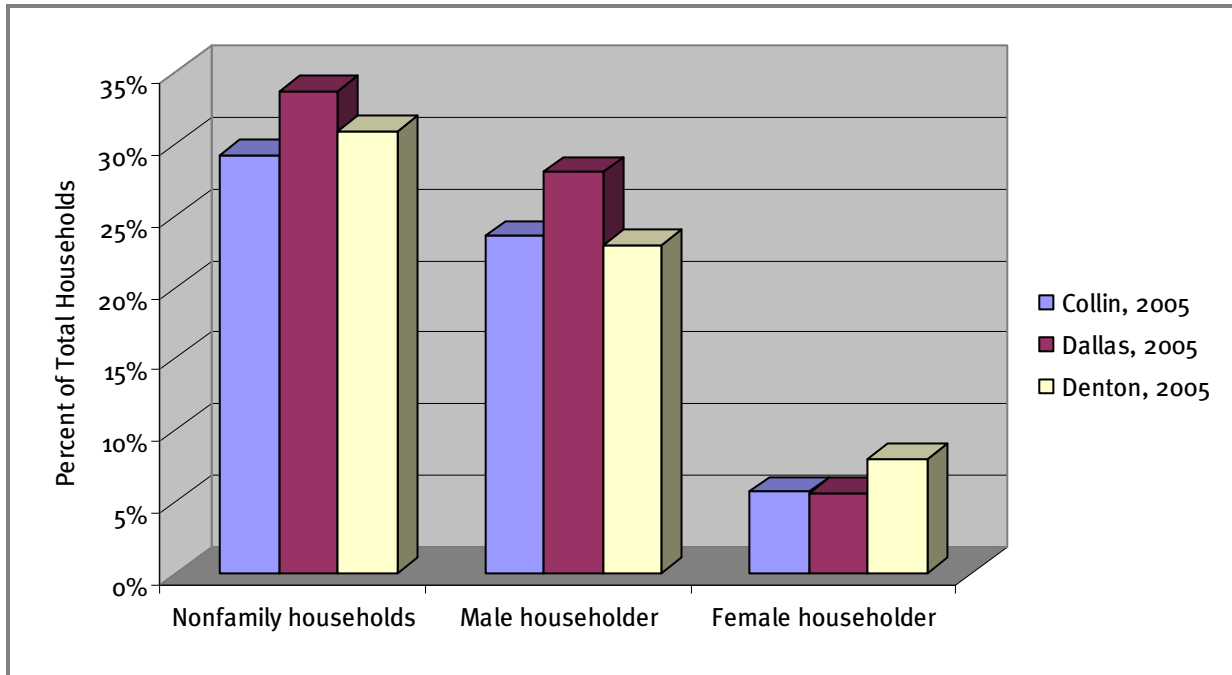

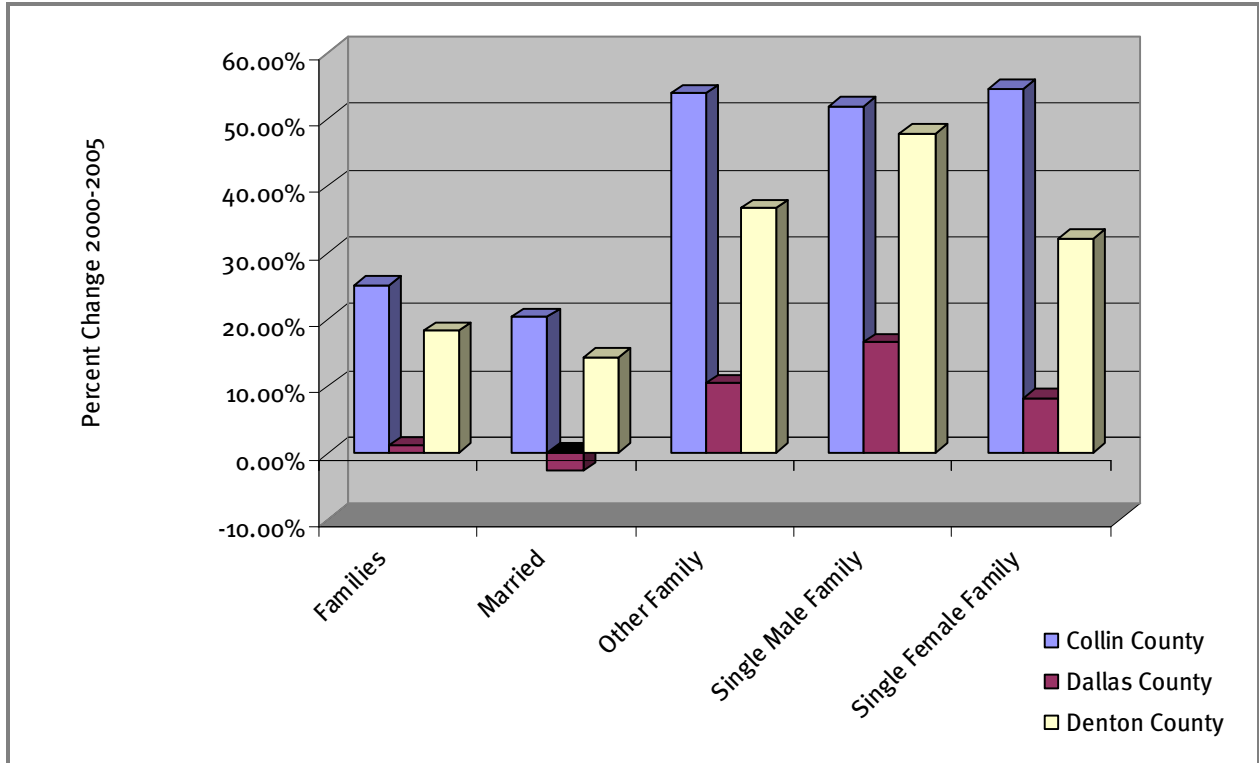
HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION: NON-FAMILIES 2005

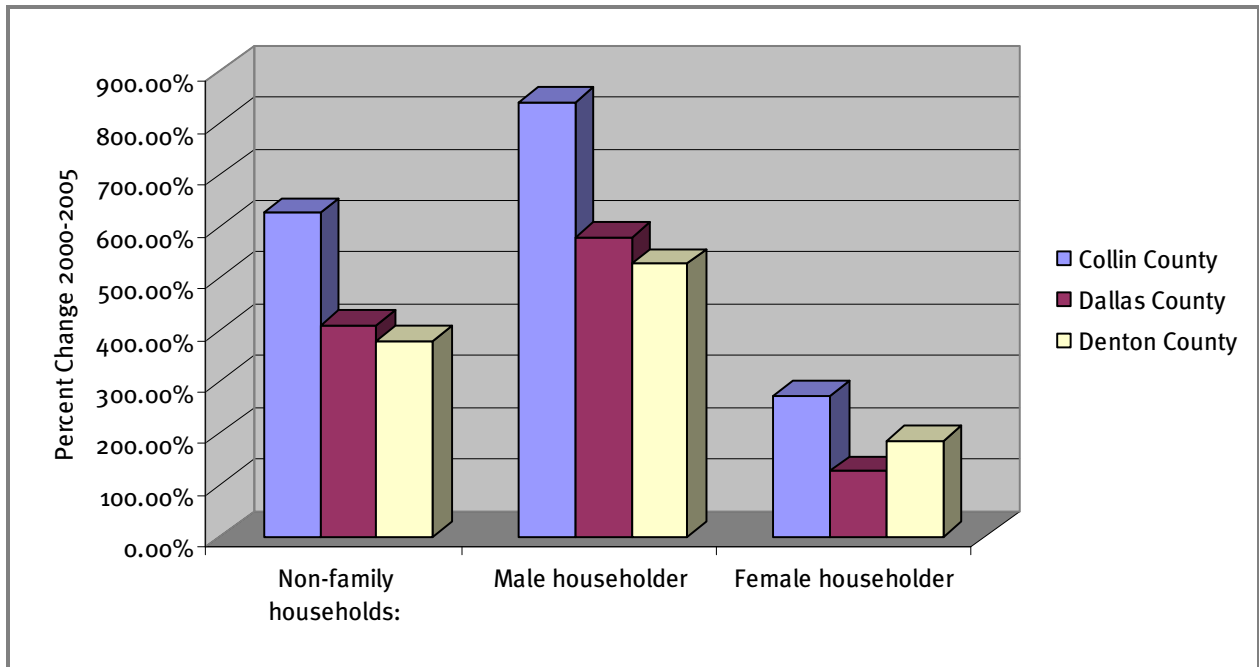
HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION: FAMILIES, PERCENT CHANGE 2000 VS. 2005

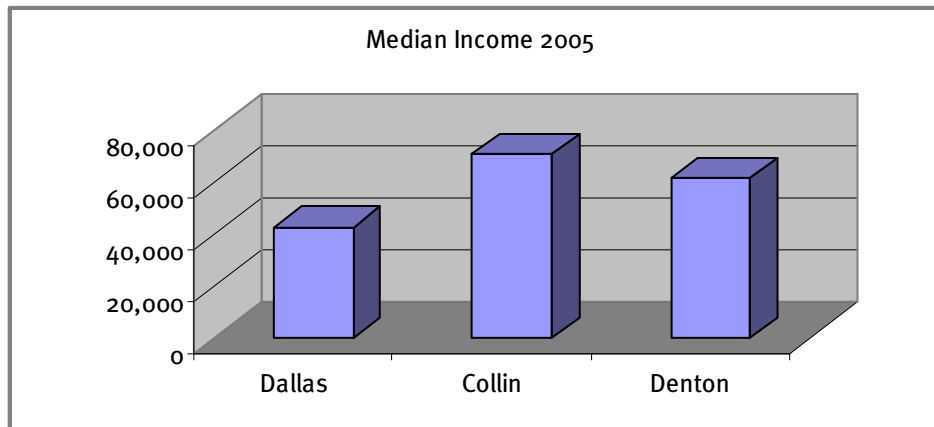

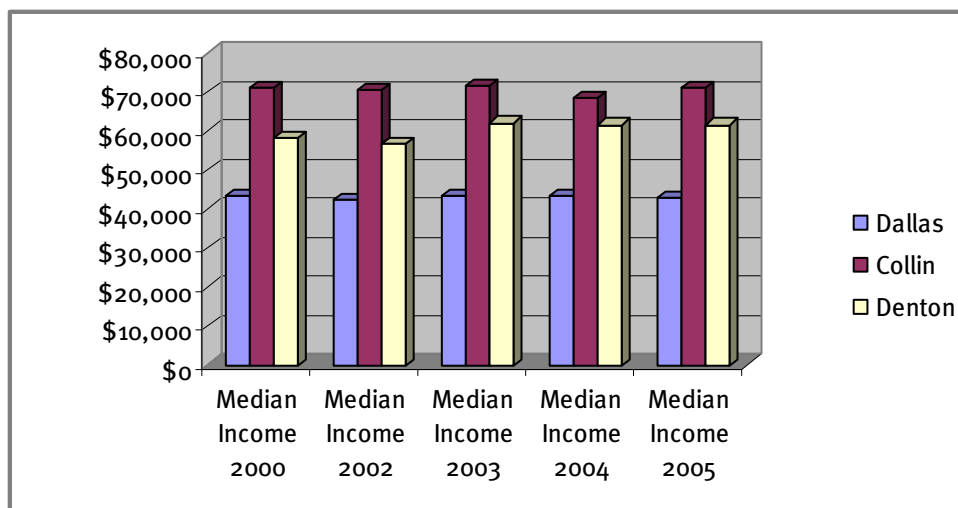

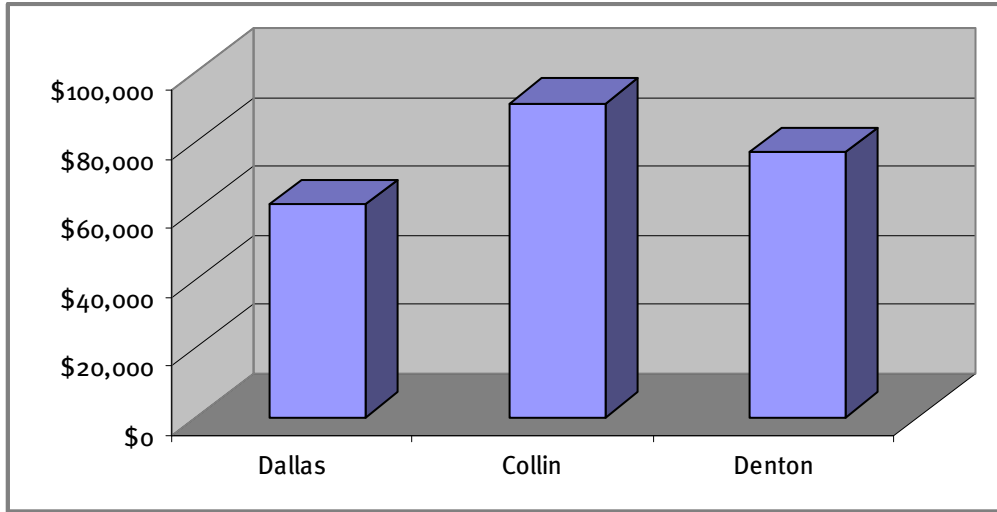

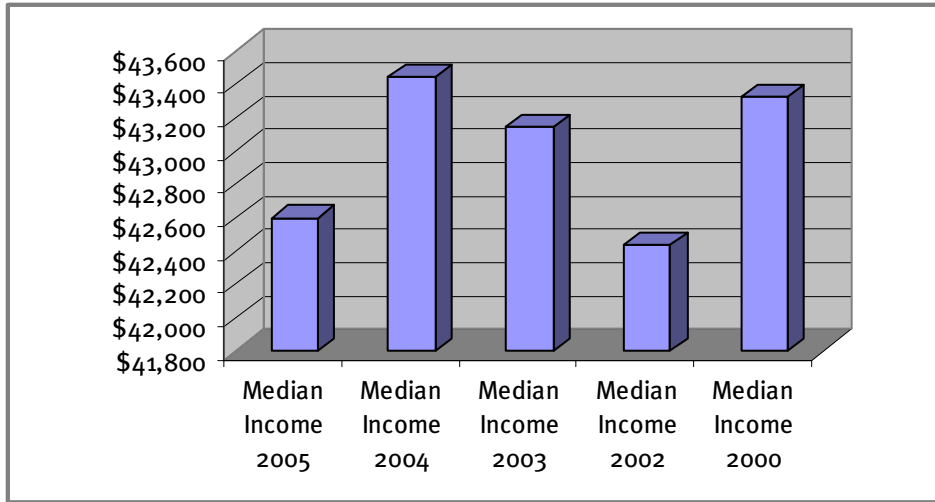

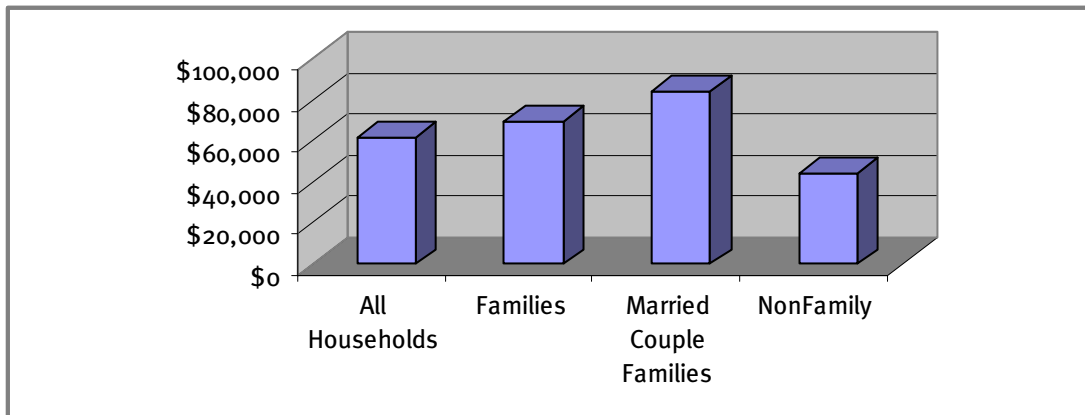

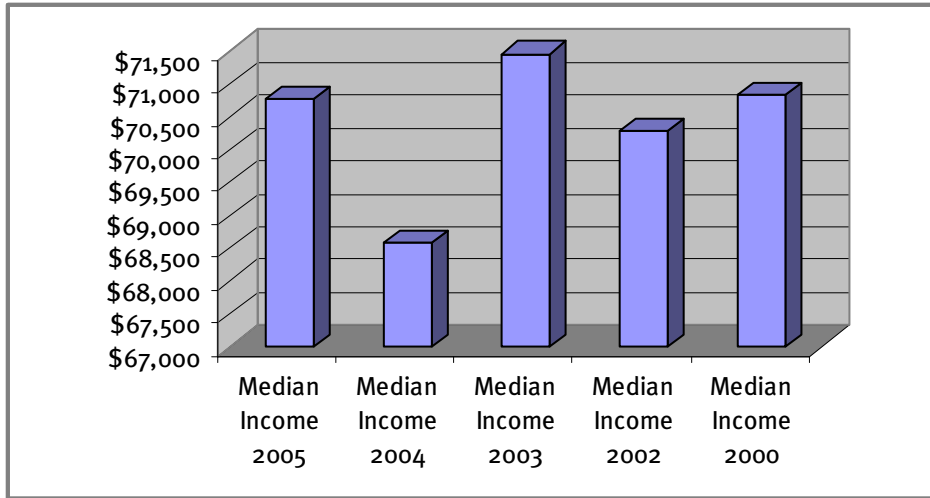

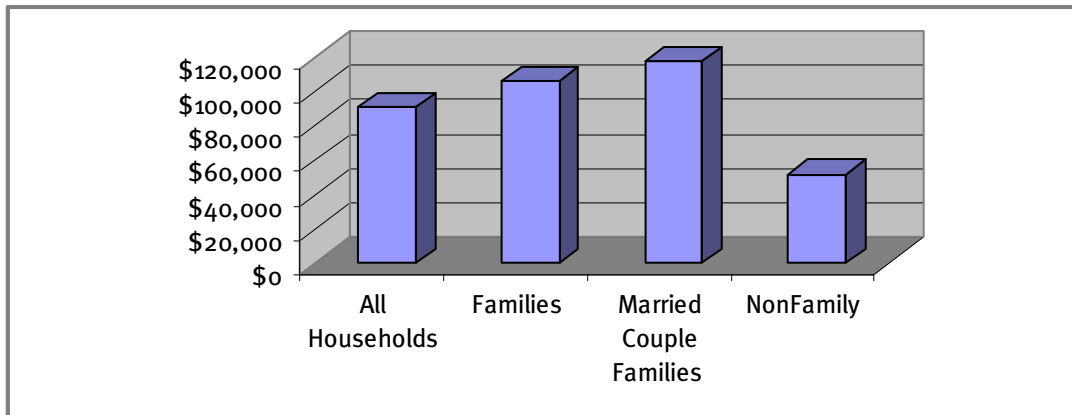

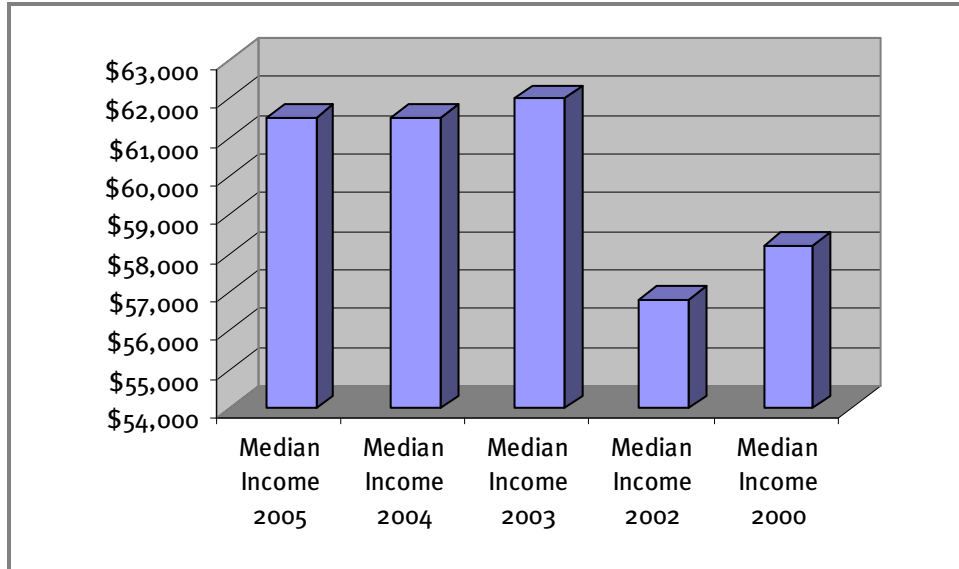

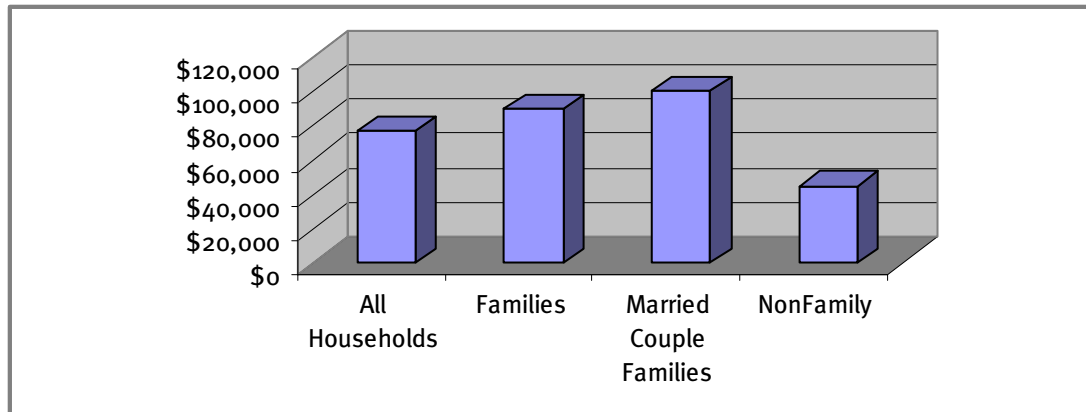

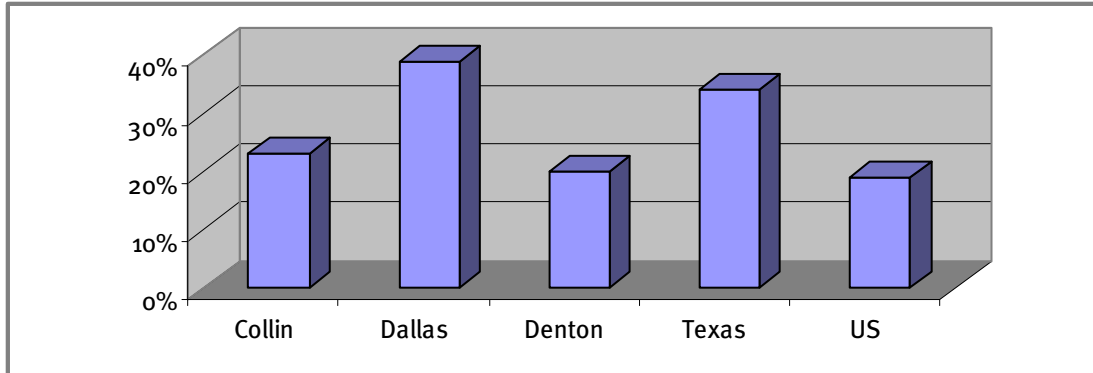

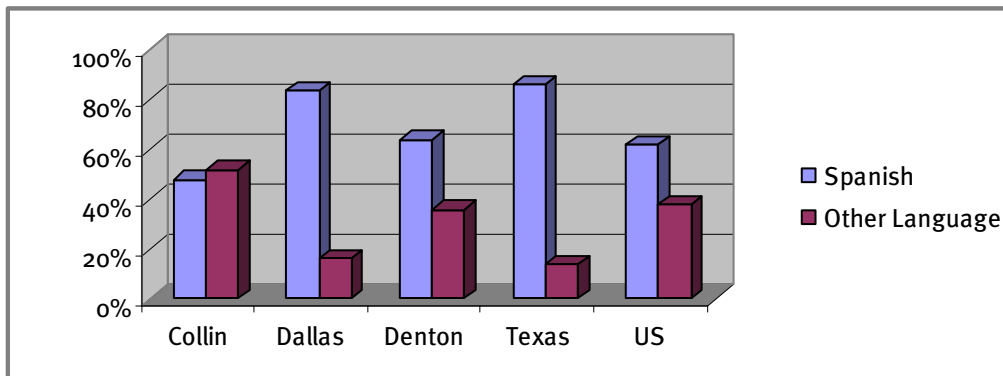

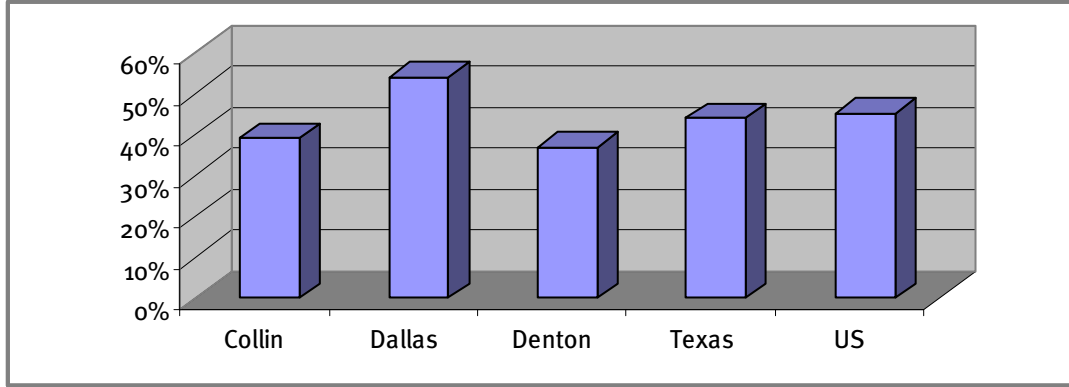

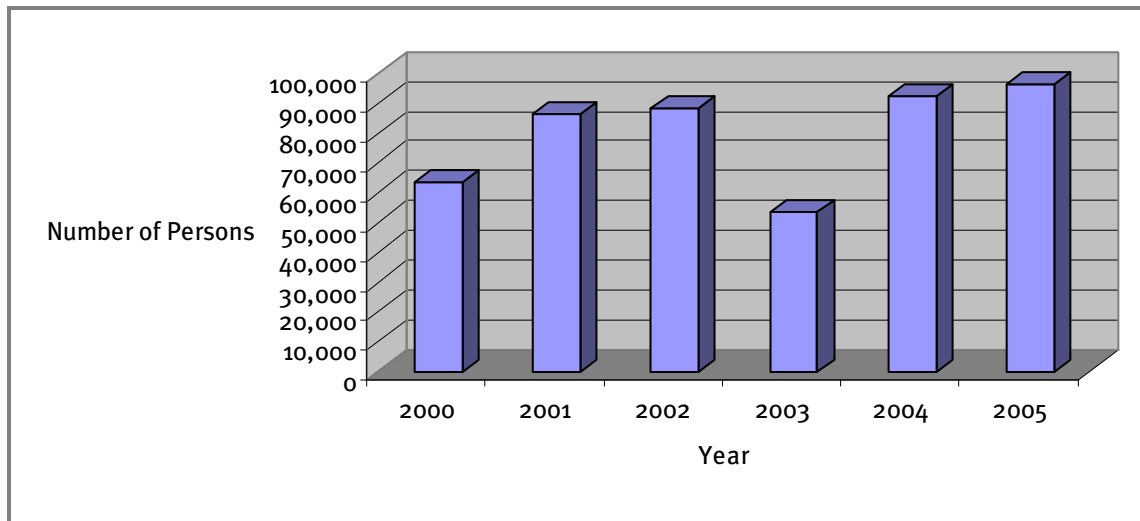

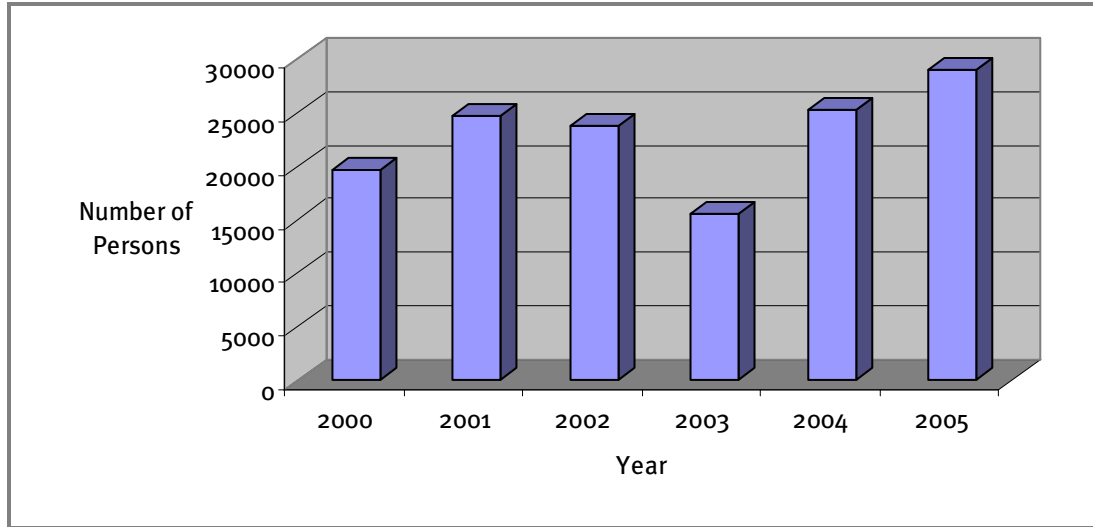

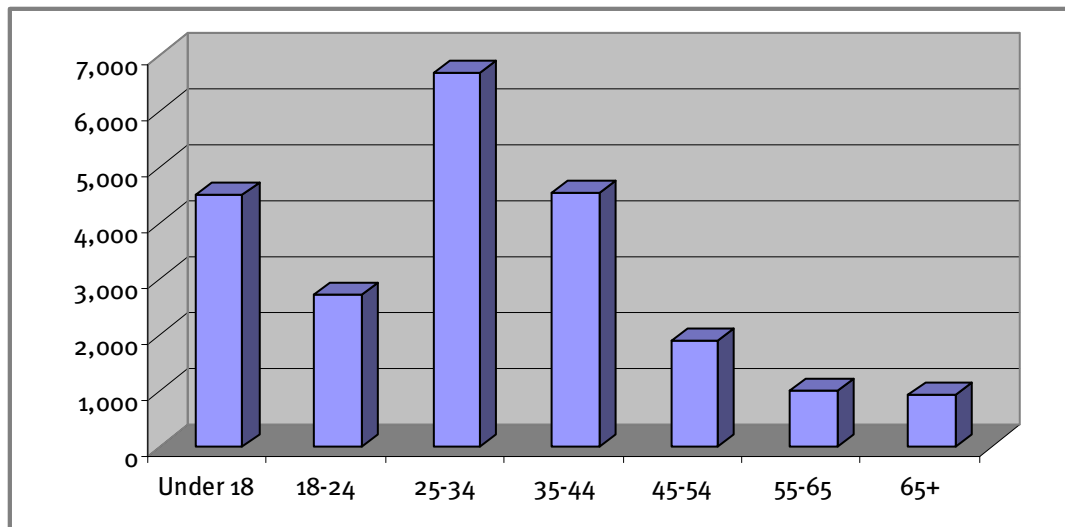

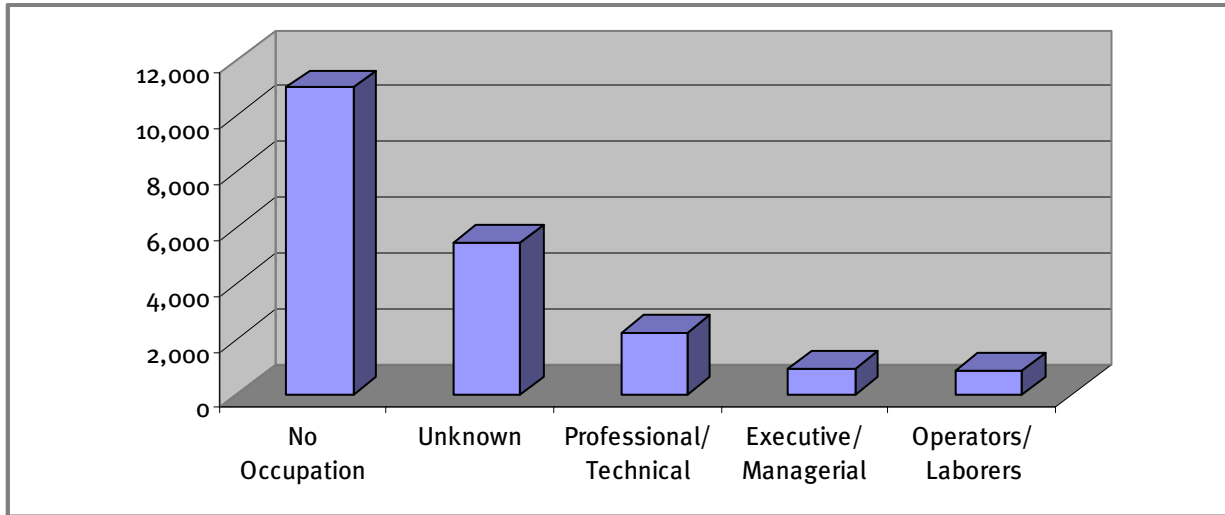

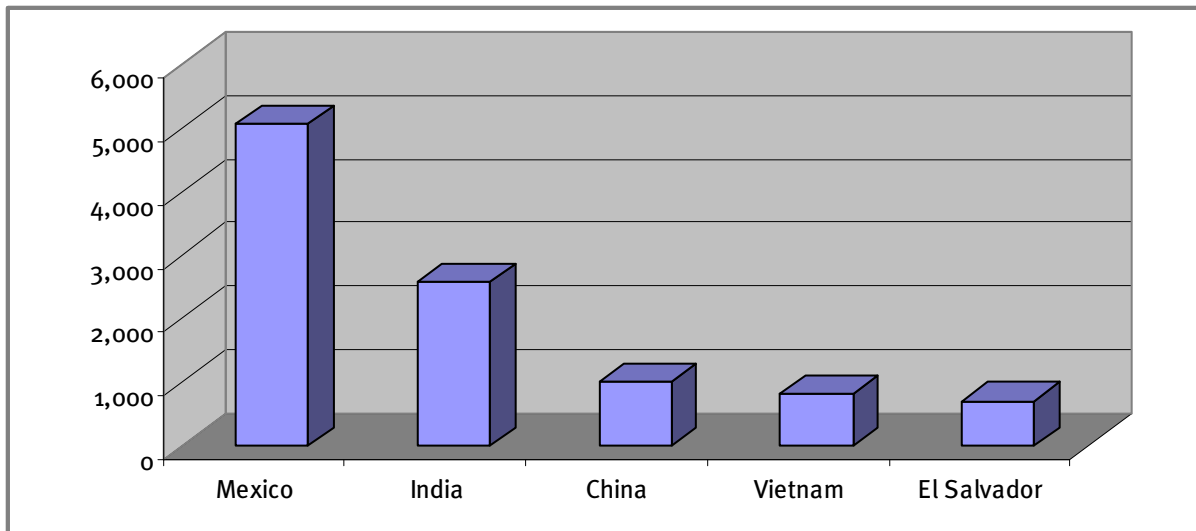
