SUMMARY

The physical and mental health of North Texas residents, including substance abuse trends and access to health care, are the focus of the Improving Health chapter. By examining key health and wellness indicators and analyzing trends over time, a picture emerges of the state of health in the United Way of Metropolitan Dallas service area. This service area encompasses four counties: Collin, Dallas, Denton, and Rockwall.

In general, indicators of health and well-being have experienced very little improvement and continue to be an issue of concern for many North Texans. Among the most pressing concerns in this area are the continued disparities between racial and ethnic groups in health insurance coverage, the high percentage of residents without health insurance, and the increasing costs of medical and dental care. Mortality rates indicate positive trends, with deaths from heart disease, cancer, and stroke declining since 1996; however, deaths from AIDS have remained stable and deaths associated with Alzheimer's disease have increased.

Other areas of concern include the estimated 350,000 Collin, Dallas, and Denton County residents with one or more disabilities, and the approximately 35,000 North Texans affected by serious mental illness. Additionally, the number of new HIV cases and the rate of obesity, a precursor of numerous health problems, continue to rise.

This report contains a section on indicator highlights for each county in the UWMD region, including: physical and mental health, mortality rates, information on sexually transmitted diseases and obesity. After that section there is a detailed breakdown of all of the data uncovered during the 2007 Community Assessment Update process. In this section you will find tables, charts, graphs, and sources for the data.

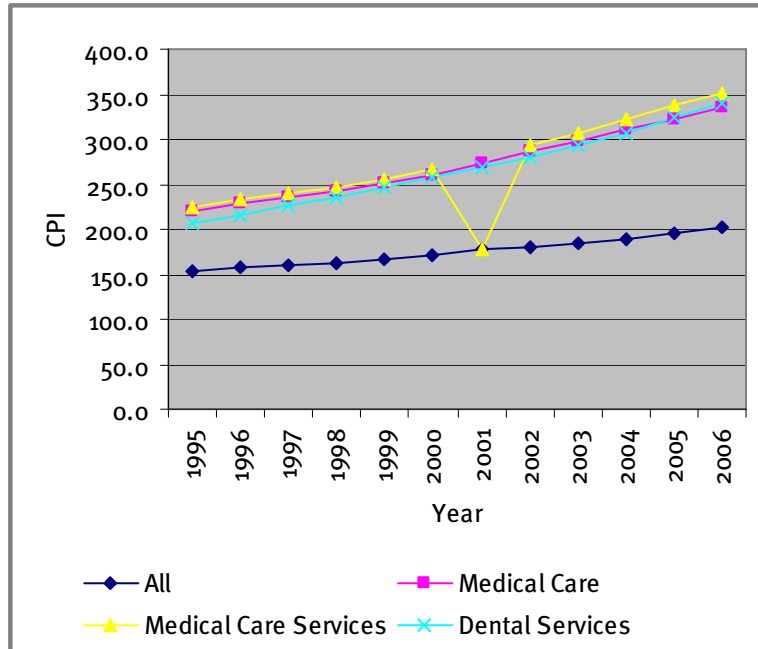

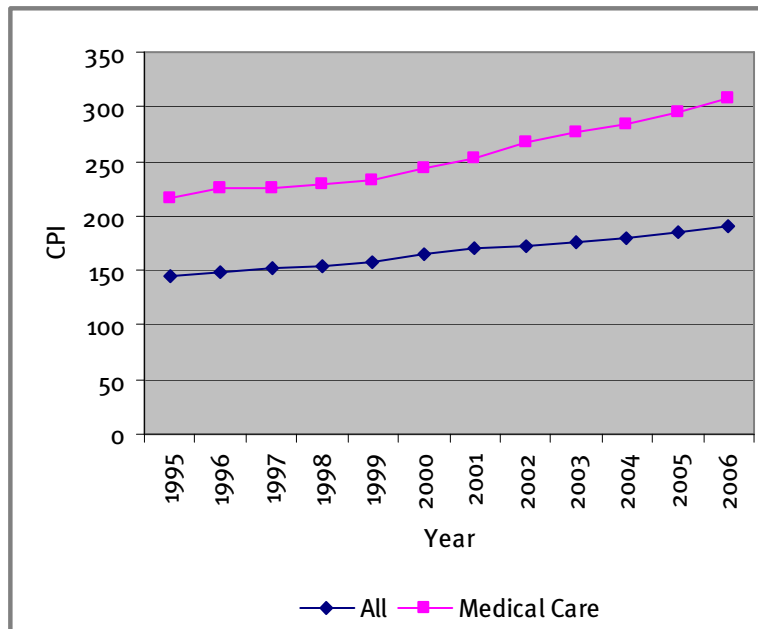

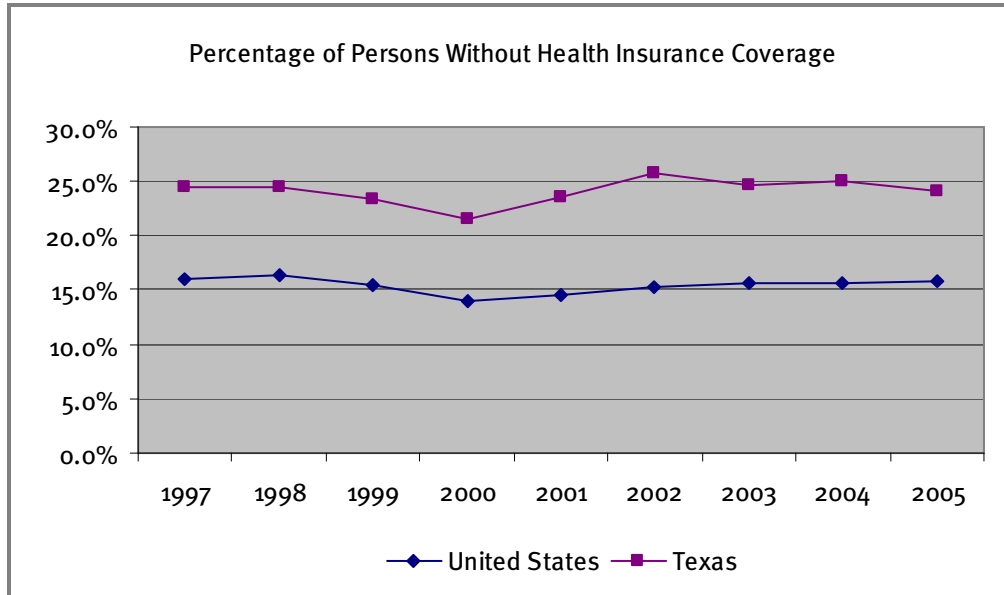

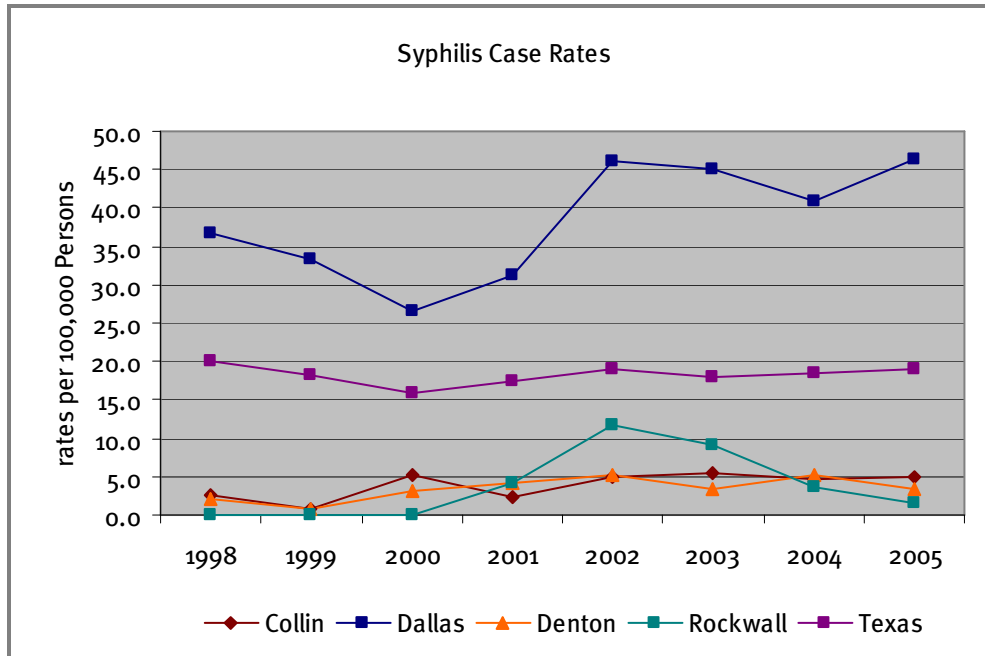
